

RECIPROCITY Q&A

Manitoba and the University of Minnesota–Twin Cities

What is reciprocity?

Students from Manitoba will pay a tuition rate that is comparable to the in-state, Minnesota resident tuition rate. For students with reciprocity, the University of Minnesota offers a great education at a competitive price.

How do I apply for reciprocity?

You must contact the Office of Admissions at the University of Minnesota for information and an application.

Do I have to apply for reciprocity every year?

No, your reciprocity tuition status is automatically renewed if you have been a continuing student. Exceptions to this include: study abroad or study on a National Student Exchange (NSE) program for an academic year, or a one-year absence from school at the U of M. If you are absent from the University of Minnesota for an academic year, for any reason, you must reapply for reciprocity.

What is the reciprocity application deadline?

Students should apply for reciprocity after they have been admitted to the U of M and before the start of the term for which they are admitted.

Can my application for reciprocity be denied?

Yes, your reciprocity will be denied if you are not considered a resident of Manitoba.

Do I have to apply for reciprocity again if I transfer to the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities from another public institution in Minnesota where I have reciprocity?

Yes, please contact the Office of Admissions to request an application for reciprocity at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities.

What if reciprocity agreements end?

If you enter the University under the current reciprocity agreement, and reciprocity is dissolved while you are a student, you will continue to be eligible for reciprocity under the original agreement. In the event that the reciprocity agreement is ever dissolved, the University would be notified by the state higher education agencies well in advance of the program's end.

**For students enrolling for fall semester 2012 and later, the reciprocity agreement with Manitoba will no longer include students in the following first professional programs: Dentistry (D.D.S), Medicine (M.D.), Pharmacy (D.Pharm), and Veterinary Medicine (D.V.M.).*
