
GREATLOCATION



SCHOLARSHIPS

Global Excellence Scholarships (GES) are competitive, merit-based scholarships awarded to international freshmen or transfer students for up to four years at \$15,000 or \$10,000 per year.

International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS)

Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, academic merit, and diversity. Last year, the awards ranged from \$5,000 to \$1,000 per year, for up to four years.

APPLICATION PROCESS

HOLISTIC REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS

Admission decisions are based on a very careful, overall assessment of each student's academic preparation and performance, as well as the additional information provided in the application. The University of Minnesota does not have automatic criteria or minimums (cut-offs) for admission.

- 3. Self-report English proficiency test score (z.umn.edu/intlenglish)



AP, IB, AND A-LEVEL CREDITS
